## CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

**Q: Who is eligible to enroll?**

A: Any high school student can enroll. Acceptance into the courses will be based on parent/guardian approval, and GPA or entrance scores on Accuplacer or ACT/SAT exams. Students must meet course prerequisites prior to enrolling. Submission of high school transcript, ACT/SAT, or placement testing is required.

**Q: Are there scholarships available?**

A: Yes, scholarships are available based upon the high school the student is attending.

*Your Path to Success!*

**Q: How do I apply?**

A: Students will work with their high school guidance counselor and John Wood liaison to complete the registration and make sure all requirements have been met.

**Q: What is the cost?**

A: Cost per credit hour for a course at the high school or on John Wood's campus is \$170. Cost per credit hour for an online course is \$200. High school students are awarded 25% reduction on original tuition and universal fees (estimated cost after reduction: structured-\$127.50 per credit hour; online-\$157.50 per credit hour). Courses taught at high school by high school instructor - \$50 per credit hour; Courses taught at high school by JWCC instructor - \$100 per credit hour.

**Q: What will the student be required to pay?**

A: The student will be responsible for tuition, fees (depending on course), and books not already provided by high school.
